With an average of **460** visits each day, Patten Free Library was a hub of activity this past year! Our library users borrowed, renewed, and downloaded over **400** items a day. We issued **783 new cards**, gave out **454 museum and park passes**, and answered thousands of research questions from our three service desks.

This year we offered **600 programs** to our community. That's more than **2 programs a day!** We gave away **1600 Grab and Go Kits** across all age groups! Kits included eclipse glasses, spice kits with recipes, slime kits, paper roll penguins, beeswax candles, and more!

## CHILDREN'S ROOM

Storytime has grown exponentially this past year, with at least fifty attendees each week. Parents have connected and shared resources with one another, children have found new friends, and all have found a love for song and story.

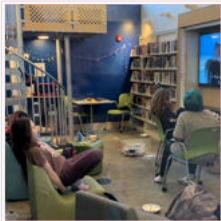


We also participated in Families CAN! and Midcoast Maine Community Action's community baby shower, where over 100 families attended a resource-sharing event and learned how PFL and other organizations can support new parents and caregivers.



Lego Club has been a weekly occurrence at PFL with kids ages 5-12 coming to play with Legos, eat snacks, and unwind in one of our air-conditioned spaces. Through this club, a parent became a weekly volunteer and runs our Minecraft club for PFL kids.

## TEEN SPACE



The Teen Space saw increased use last year, with teens coming to hang out, watch movies, and use our Wii. We offer passive programs like paint by sticker, watercolors, beads, and the popular monthly Grab and Go Kits.

The Teen Pantry, a free resource for toiletries, snacks, and school supplies, is in high demand and is restocked multiple times each week, thanks to donations from patrons, the Bath Area Food Bank and hats and scarves from PFL's Knitting Circle.

New this year is a microwave, allowing hungry teens to make ramen, oatmeal, and hot chocolate.

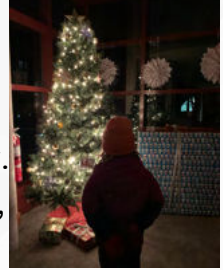


# IMPACT STORIES

## ADULTS

Throughout the year, PFL has continued to offer a variety of adult programming for all different areas of interest, including author talks, technology classes, climate advocacy, book and movie discussion groups, art projects and talks, and free coffee every Friday.

December of 2023 saw the return of Starry Night, our annual luminary walk in Library Park, and the addition of A Night at the Patten and Tiny Art show. We celebrated the season with hundreds of guests, sold local art, and raised money for the library.



In the spring, PFL partnered with the Bath Area YMCA on their DEI Programming Series: *Acknowledging our Past to Create a More Inclusive Future*. The lineup included Maine State Archivist Kate McBrien, Maine State Poet Laureate Julie Bouwsma, and Pamela Cummings, president of the Board of Directors of the Abyssinian Meeting House. This was a highly successful collaboration, and the Bath Area YMCA awarded PFL a Social Responsibility Award at their annual dinner.

PFL was also awarded a grant from the Maine Humanities Council to host Racial Equity and Reconciliation Advocate Dustin Ward for a series on Race and Equality in Literary Voices.

## HISTORY ROOM

In April we received a donation of a watercolor from the daughter of an artist that grew up in Bath. It was her wish that the painting of library park during Heritage Days (painted sometime in the early 90s) be donated to the library and put on display. Her daughter was able to see it hanging in the building when she participated in Art in the Park this Heritage Days.



# IMPACT STORIES



The History Room has been helping the Children’s Room staff find photos and artifacts to use at the American Girl Doll Club meetings. For the Victorian Era we were able to find a leather satchet of photos of the Elmhurst mansion’s grounds and interiors right after it was finished, and of course, for Kit Kitteridge we got the typewriter out.

That’s been a great way of showing that historical/archival materials aren’t necessarily “boring” and can reach all different kinds of age groups while also increasing our inter-departmental collaboration.

The 2024 Town History Series was the 20th anniversary of the lecture series which was started in 2004 by then-manager of the History Room, Peter Goodwin. This year’s talks included topics such as a video history of Day’s Ferry in Woolwich and the establishment of Reid State Park in Georgetown. The Town History Series remains so popular in-person attendance often threatened to exceed room capacity with was often matched one-to-one by online attendance. We are already excitedly beginning to plan the 2025 series.

# FRIENDS OF PFL

The Friends continue to focus on promoting the resources and services of the library, sponsoring programs, and providing financial support through a variety of activities.

The bookstore generated \$45,380 and, after expenses, a net income for the library of \$30,817. Over 50 volunteers supported the bookstore, producing an average contribution-in-kind per volunteer of \$592.

By the end of this fiscal year we provided \$15,850 from the Heritage Days and April book sales, membership dues, donations, and Starry Night food sales. Combined with the bookstore income, the Friends contributed a total \$46,667 to the Patten Free Library. Other activities this year included sponsoring 2 teen-teams in the Spelling Bee, sponsoring the Writing Contest, and providing prizes for the Summer Reading Program.

In June 2024 John Dunn was appointed Acting President of the Friends. John moved to Bath in 2016 from New York State's Hudson Valley, where he was involved with libraries at both the local and regional levels. He was formally elected to the post at the Friends annual meeting in October.

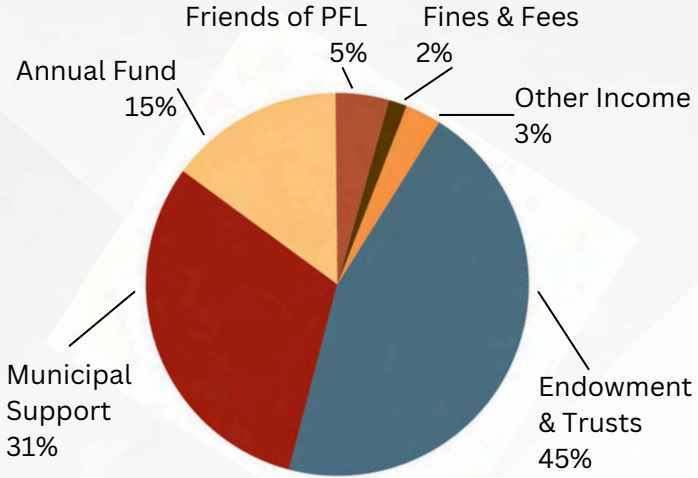
## VOLUNTEERS

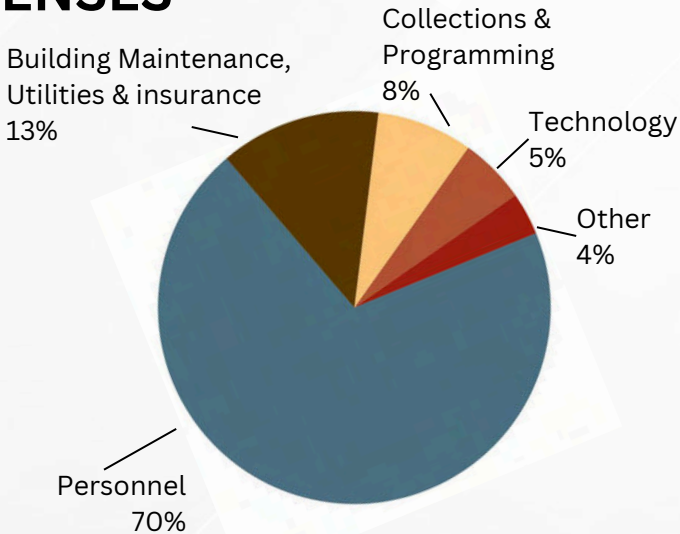
